


## **GDR-Game**

# A Hands-On Experience of History

The permanent exhibition portrays all the different facets of life in the DDR. Three sections shed light on different aspects of the everyday life of DDR citizens from public and private life, across to ideology and the sphere of power. All of which were completely interwoven during the DDR dictatorship. The DDR Museum illustrates everyday life in a dictatorship, as well as the sphere of governmental institutions, the Stasi, the planned economy or the Wall. There is always something to discover, whether it be by going on a Trabi driving simulation or simply by rummaging through the recreated high-rise tower block apartment. There are countless doors, drawers and flaps to open which encourage the students to actively take part in the museum and thus to discover its many objects, explanation texts and innovative digital installations. This interactive layout is considered to be unique in the world. The exhibition has already been nominated twice for the European Museum of the Year Award.

# FAQ

### >How many people constitute a group?

The group price is available for 10 persons or more.

### Does the DDR Museum also open on public holidays?

The museum is open on every public holiday. However, we close at 4pm on the 24.12, and the 31.12.

### Is the museum also open on Mondays?

Yes. The museum is open on Mondays from 10am to 8pm.

### Is entrance free-of-charge on a Thursday?

No. The DDR Museum is privately-owned and finances its activities only through visitor takings. We are therefore unable to grant free entrance.

### Can I take photographs in the museum?

Yes, but only for private use.

### >How much time should a school group plan for a visit?

On average, school groups need between 1,5 and 2 hours.

#### >Can I follow an ongoing tour?

No. At present, we are only able to provide tours to pre-booked groups. We do not offer public tours due to a lack of demand. Pre-booked tours are much more affordable than you think!

### >Can I cancel my booking? Will I still be charged?

Individual tickets within a group can be cancelled free of charge at any time, as long as the tickets have not yet been paid for. Cancellations by customers are free of charge up until a week before the planned visit at latest. We are unable to cancel individual tickets for group visits that have been paid for in advance.
